Drop-off and Pick-ups


Inclement Weather Closures

Volunteer Credits

To enhance each child's experience at our school, we must all work together. Each GRMS family is expected to earn 500 points (or pay \$200.00) during the schoolyear to satisfy this effort.

500 Points - Meets \$200.00 Requirement

450 Points – Deduct \$180.00
400 Points – Deduct \$160.00
350 Points – Deduct \$140.00
300 Points – Deduct \$120.00
250 Points – Deduct \$100.00
200 Points – Deduct \$80.00
150 Points – Deduct \$60.00
75 Points – Deduct \$30.00

We will post various volunteer tasks throughout the year for families to take advantage of.

Families can pick and choose what fundraiser(s) they would like to support. Twenty percent of the profits can apply to the annual fundraising responsibility; the other 20% goes directly into the school's Activity Account that is spent directly on special school events and staff development activities.

You can deduct \$20 per month for signing up to provide snack for both classrooms. Twenty-five points are given for helping on a field trip or volunteering at the YMCA for the Friday swim lessons.
