Dear GRMS Families,

Happy February! The preschool and kindergarten children will be celebrating 100 days of school on February 2nd. We are more than halfway through the schoolyear!

February is pre-registration month for the fall. Current families have priority if they pre-register this month. Fall returning registration fee will also be waived (you'll pay \$50.00 per child now instead of \$100 in the fall). Beginning March 1st, any openings will be available to new families. We already have a growing list of those who want to enroll. An Open House is scheduled for Saturday, March 1st between 11-2. This will be a great time for you to visit your child's classroom. Any new families will be able to register at the Open House.

As we plan for future enrollment (summer and fall 2025), we will have the following age groupings. This is based on AMS accreditation standards.

U-1, U-2, and U-3 - 3–6-year-olds in all classrooms (kindergarten can have a separate extended day after lunch)

D-1-3 months – 18 months (sometimes up to 24 months)

D-2-19 months -35 months (sometimes beyond 35 months)

Lower Elementary – 1st-3rd grade

Upper Elementary/Middle School – 4th-6th and 7th -9th

Adjustments are made due to child's abilities **and** classroom availability. Age range can vary in the D-1 and D-2 classrooms.

We recently launched our own accredited Teacher Education training program, teaching adults to work with birth to three and three- to six-year-olds. The program operates under the name of Mount Rainier Montessori Teacher Preparation. We are excited to have 12 adults in our program which runs from January through December. We look forward to an accreditation visit sometime this year.

GRMS is implementing a new communication system, using the Procare Family Engagement app. An email invitation was sent out to all families to register for the app. If you did not see the email, please let Andrea know and a new invitation will be The Procare Family Engagement App provides instant communications and mobile payments. The mobile app allows parents to be immersed in their children's day-to-day activities, including tracking developmental milestones, sharing photos and videos as well as enabling two way communication. The Procare Child Care Mobile App is available across North America on both Apple iOS and Android devices.

Spring Festival

Our annual Spring Festival will be held on Thursday, May 8th from 6-7:30pm at Green River College. Children from each classroom will perform on-stage. The infants and toddlers from D-1 and D-2 will have a short video clip in lieu of their on-stage performance. Immediately after the performance we will do our "cake run." More information will be in next month's newsletter.

Funds raised will help us pay for the venue, beverages, and tech support for the performance (approximately \$3,000). It will also help pay for the baskets, wrap, and other supplies needed for the event (approximately \$800).

We will be asking each family to do one or more of the following:

- 1. Donate an item for the silent auction basket.
- 2. Donate a cake for the "cake run."
- 3. Donate or **secure a service** for the silent auction (haircut, massage, gift card, your vacation condo for the weekend, car detail, overnight stay at a hotel that you work for, IT tech services, carwash, etc.). If you frequent a business, ask them for a donation of cash or service. We will provide advertising on our website and in our newsletter for May and June.

This event is a fun gathering for the entire family.

Montessori Week

February 25- March 1 is recognized as Montessori Week in honor of Dr. Maria Montessori. Her teaching method is the basis of our school philosophy. Dr. Montessori's unique teaching method and materials promote self-teaching in a prepared environment that enlightens the child's spirit. Please join us in a tribute to Dr. Maria Montessori the entire week at the end of February.

Morning Arrival Time

If your child is arriving to school after 9:00am, they are missing out of some very important lessons! The first hour sets the stage for their morning work time. Beginning at 8:30am, lessons are given in math, language, science, and cultural studies with children able to begin their own independent work in these areas. Not only does your child miss out of the morning lessons, but arriving late disrupts the concentration of the others who are already engaged. It takes time from the teacher, who must leave a lesson and greet the arriving child. The teacher then must get the child engaged and explain the plan for the morning. There are hundred of studies that support the importance of arriving on time (just Google it!).

Drop-offs

For those families who are still dropping their child off at the classroom, please make the drop-off brief and at the hallway door (not inside the classroom). It is disruptive to the others who are already engaged in their morning work cycle.

Planning Committee Members Needed

Please email us if you would like to be on the Planning Committee for our Spring Auction, scheduled in May. The committee helps in various aspects from helping to secure donations, putting together baskets, setting up for the event, and general brainstorming.

Much appreciation to those families for picking up their children at or before closing. It is hard for someone to stay beyond their 8-hour shift. In addition, every staff member departs at 4:30. Leaving just one staff member to stay back with a late child is risky.
